

Maleny-Kenilworth Road, Conondale landslip repairs North Coast Region – Natural Disaster Program

June 2024

The Department of Transport and Main Roads' (TMR) contractor will soon begin landslip repair works on Maleny-Kenilworth Road, near Fleiter Road, Conondale.

A map of the works location is shown on the reverse of this flyer.

Works are scheduled to start **early July 2024** and will take approximately **four weeks** to complete, weather and site conditions permitting.



Key works

- Clearing and excavating.
- Installing rockfill.
- Replacing damaged stormwater drainage.
- Landscaping including topsoil and turf.



What to expect

- Works will be undertaken Monday to Friday between 6.30am and 6.30pm.
- Some weekend and night works may be required and Variable Messaging Signs (VMS) will be used to advise road users prior to any night works.
- One lane of Maleny-Kenilworth Road will be closed while works are underway, with temporary traffic control in place. Both lanes will be open outside of work hours.
- During works heavy machinery including excavators, concrete trucks and mobile cranes will be accessing the work site.
- Traffic controllers, reduced speed limits, road signage and VMS will be in place to advise of the changed traffic conditions and to ensure motorist and road worker safety.
- Nearby residents may experience noise, light, vibration and dust from construction activities.
- Reversing beepers and flashing lights are a safety requirement and will be used during works.
- Motorists may experience delays and are encouraged to drive to the changed traffic conditions, obey signage and reduced speed limits at all times.
- Priority access through the work site will be given to emergency vehicles.

TMR understands roadworks can be frustrating for nearby residents, businesses and road users and acknowledges your cooperation and patience during works.

The Maleny-Kenilworth landslip repairs are being undertaken as part of a broader program of rectification work to repair more than 200 batter slope/embankment sites across North Coast Region damaged by the 2022 flooding and rain events.

The recovery works are jointly funded by the Australian and Queensland Governments through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).










Location of works
